GAYLE HICKS FRIPP PAID INTERNSHIP**

UNC Greensboro and the Greensboro History Museum are pleased to announce the Fripp Internship for UNCG Museum Studies graduate students for the summer of 2018. The internship honors Gayle Hicks Fripp, UNCG alumna, former museum assistant director and distinguished author, in recognition of her contributions to the field of public history and service to the Greensboro community.

The internship has a stipend of \$2,000 and requires a minimum of 200 hours. Insurance, sick leave, social security, state and federal taxes are not included. Internship hours may be worked mid-May to early-August, with the actual schedule determined after selection.

This is an excellent opportunity for a student to learn and apply best professional practices of museum education and interpretation, and gain valuable professional experience at a Smithsonian Affiliate and American Alliance of Museums-accredited institution. Working under supervision of museum staff, the intern will lead the development and implementation of an innovative and engaging summer program for students. There will also be the opportunity, based on the intern's interest, to support the creation of new educational initiatives linked with community outreach. More broadly, the intern will perform a mix of public engagement and behind-the-scenes work, serve as member of a project team, participate in a number of museum operations, and become familiar with a range of museum professions.

- 1. a personal statement describing your reasons for seeking the internship, your related experience, and how your efforts might benefit the Greensboro History Museum;**
- 2. a resume with contact information for two academic or work references;**
- 3. your academic transcript (unofficial accepted).**
